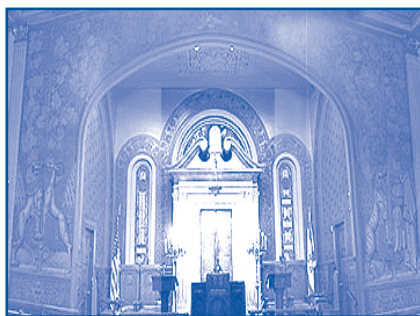

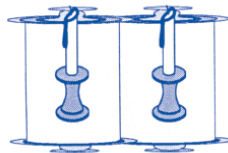

In Memoriam

We mourn the passing
of our dear Center member

RUTH BRAUNSCHWEIG



May her memory be for a blessing.

We mark with sorrow the passing of Mrs. Ruth Braunschweig. Ruth, current matriarch of the family, and her late husband, Dr. I. Morton (Morty) Braunschweig, were the second of five generations that have been associated with ACI since its inception.

The Braunschweig Family was a driving force in our creation and dedicated benefactors throughout our shared history. The plaque on the lobby's south wall lists Morty's brother Julius as our first recording secretary in 1926. Going back as far as 1921, meetings took place in the home of Morty's parents, Jennie and Morris Braunschweig, to determine how best to meet the needs of the area's burgeoning Jewish population. Jennie was the driving force in creating an organization large enough to house a Hebrew School as well as provide social and cultural programs for these families. This evolved into the erection of our historic building, with Jennie as the first president of our Parent's Association (later known as the Ladies Guild). In a 1927 tribute to the early founders, Jennie was referred to as its "Mother."

This dedication and zeal for the Center was passed down to Ruth and Morty's generation—as part of a group that socialized together and worked to better the synagogue and the community. During the time that Morty was president of the ACI—1946 to 1948—the couple actively helped Rabbi Goldberg muster support for our brethren in Palestine and subsequently in Israel.

Morty and later their son Ralph maintained a dental practice at 30-96 35th Street for 65 years. Even after moving out of the neighborhood, the Braunschweig Family has retained their affiliation and participation in Center life through the years. It was only in the previous two years that Ruth had been unable to accompany Ralph and his family at our High Holy Day services.

Sincere condolences to Ruth's three children: Dr. Ralph J. Braunschweig & wife Faith, Judith Pastolove & husband Joel, and Marshall Braunschweig & wife Marion; six grandchildren: Matthew, Jacqueline & husband Chad, Michael & wife Sherri, Howard & wife Debbie, Dr. Ira & wife Kim, and Dr. Heidi; seven great-grandchildren; and the entire family.

Her place is empty; she will be missed.

FROM THE RABBI'S STUDY



What do Thanksgiving and Sukkot have in common? Chanukah, of course!

Many Jewish sources, including passages in the Talmud, attest to connections between Sukkot and Chanukah. So what about Thanksgiving and Chanukah and Sukkot? The connection revolves around two occurrences: the Maccabees delayed celebration of Sukkot once they redeemed and purified the Temple; and the Pilgrims' celebration of Thanks, which stemmed from the holiday of Sukkot. The Pilgrims' deep familiarity with and reverence for the Bible led them to use a Biblical holiday of Thanks—Sukkot—as a model for celebration, which led to the American holiday of Thanksgiving.

But the connection between Thanksgiving and Chanukah goes deeper and is rife with guidance for our lives.

The author E. Scott O'Connor wrote of a young person asking of a very sad, lonely man, "What is life's heaviest burden?" The man's response: "To have nothing worthwhile to carry."

I think of all the burdens that people have in life. And then I think of the differences in what people consider to be burdens. I am amazed at some of the things I've heard that people consider burdens: children, teaching, thinking, leading, working, growth, standing up for what's right, values, integrity, defending country, defeating evil.

The writer and thinker C.S. Lewis spoke about what it means to defeat evil: "Evil is always man's doing, yet it is never his destiny. The power of choice makes evil possible, but it is also the only thing that makes possible any love, or goodness, or joy worth having." Drawing on biblical wisdom, he emphasizes the intense power of choice. Indeed, we each have a choice: Whether we look at those things listed above as bothersome burdens and confront them with heaviness, weariness, resentment, and hostility. This choice is lightweight—it offers nothing of value, nothing worthwhile to carry. Or the other choice: we look at that list and declare that these things are truly a blessing. Perish the thought that they be a burden—carrying these is a blessing to us.

With the approach of Chanukah, I am—and I believe we should all be—so thankful to have the blessing of carrying such values and such wonders as these, and standing for them. The Maccabees fought for these—can we do less than carry the worthwhile burden of upholding these and keeping the flame burning—brightly? We can surely do more—how could anyone do less?

May the light and meaning and example of Chanukah provide for us the guidance to make the right—even if difficult—choices; may Chanukah illuminate for us the distinctions between burden and blessing; may Chanukah grant us the wisdom to see and understand the astonishing and lasting potential in just one cruise of pure oil; may we be deeply proud of our land, our people, our heritage; may we be worthy descendants of what we have inherited and worthy progenitors of what is yet to come.
